

Construction of the World Trade Center Orlando Facility

The World Trade Center Orlando was incorporated in the Fall of 1990. World Trade Center Orlando is one of 289 World Trade Centers in 85 countries around the world. The goal of every World Trade Center license holder is to develop a world-class facility that will serve as the center of trade in a specific region. World Trade Center Orlando serves the entire Central Florida region. The majority of tenants are companies and traders involved in some capacity with international trade. Trade is an approximate \$120 billion business for Florida, with one out of every four persons in Florida working directly in some form of trade. The World Trade Center Orlando facility will feature state of the art office space, and will be headquarters for some of Central Florida's most prominent corporations and professionals.
